

**CHURCH AND STATE IN THE TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY
RE-IMAGINING ESTABLISHMENT FOR THE POST-ELIZABETHAN AGE**

The Ecclesiastical Law Society is promoting a public discussion of the nature of establishment and the challenges it may face in the future, both from a constitutional vantage point and in parochial ministry for the national church. Panels of distinguished speakers will consider subjects such as the role of the monarch as Supreme Governor of the Church of England, the obligations of the national church in relation to marriage, baptism and burial, and public worship generally, the presence of Anglican bishops in the legislature, the place of an established church in an increasingly diverse and secular society. Some of the speakers will address the centenaries of, respectively, the Enabling Act 1919 and the Church in Wales Act 1914.
